Life has changed here after Covid situation all over nobody can go a shore any port and a lot of restrictions all over. Once again thanks for remembering me and my family and I will quickly write few lines and send you a photo of the ships crew now if that is ok Take care and stay safe.



The pandemic has been one of the most challenging times for seafarers. Working far from home and family has always been difficult, but in the pandemic this situation has worsened as we cannot go off shore. Work has become the only thing we do for months. Many men and women are stuck onboard, unable to go home; some sailing for over a year. This is extremely tough for our morale and mental health. In times like this I feel so grateful for seamens clubs like Stella Maris, that used to be a safe place for all seafarers. I miss my visits to Stella Maris, meeting Fr. My Own Experience!

This Thursday, July 22, I, once again accompanied the Father Samuel, the seminarian Tai and my colleague Arthur on their visit and Mass aboard of the M/V Beatrice ship. In particular, this is one of the most important moments in both my professional and interpersonal life due to the relevance and impact caused in the context religious, social, psychological and human, of the crews that arrive at this port. Furthermore, those who have never experienced this experience cannot measure how great it is to approach, meet, listen, welcome and feel the joy of seafarers with our presence. Even working for ten years at Stella Maris Santos, going on board is always a feeling of being for the first time; the place, the people, the nationalities, the languages, the climate, the smell and the simple fact of getting on board, are challenging and immeasurable aspects for those who work in this pastoral. I also remember that when walking today along the port extension, between the container, pier one to four of the Tiplam Terminal, I observed, beyond the beautiful view, the sympathy and joy of the port workers when they saw us pass by; arriving on board, we were welcomed by the seafarers on duty who led us to a small waiting room; my look and impression were one of gratitude, emotion and joy when I came across a different scene, decorated with typical Philippine Christmas arrangements. This simple scenario conveyed a synergy that involved us emotionally. The team soon began to organize the space, prepare the liturgical material, the table for Holy Mass and little by little, the seafarers were arriving and looking for a place to sit. There, I could see and feel on the faces of the seafarers, moments of great faith, hope, gratitude and longing for their loved ones, as they are people who are months away from home and their families. The Mass celebrated by Fr. Samuel brought hope and gave them more strength to continue their arduous journey of valuable and important work for all peoples and nations. I also witnessed a gesture of great nobility when, at the end of the Mass, the Captain offered a basket of fruit to the father; this attitude represented for me a feeling of sharing, solidarity, kindness, love, gratuity and communion with God. Thanks to the Captain and his crew for providing us with unforgettable moments like these; I ask God to lead them safely through these difficult times of pandemic. Thanks!


